Thanks to recycling techniques it is possible to transform plastic bottles into fleece with which it is possible to make clothes, blankets, hats and gloves.






PET (100% recyclable synthetic material of plastic) allows the production of furnishing fabrics that achieve excellent flame retardant and smoke-free characteristics.
